They all came together on April 20th to make another Boston Marathon just that much more interesting. Hey, as any race director knows, what would any race be if everything went smoothly?

A few Colonials ran and a few Colonials went out to the 17 mile mark (or so) to cheer the runners on. Colonial cheerers supply water and post a board with projected finishing times, based on the runner's pace at that point in the race. 
